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- Seller's Broker: A broker who lists a property, or a salesperson who is licensed to the listing broker, represents 14. the Seller and acts on behalf of the Seller. A Seller's broker owes to the Seller the fiduciary duties described 15. 16. on page two (2).(2) The broker must also disclose to the Buyer material facts as defined in MN Statute 82.54, 17. Subd. 3, of which the broker is aware that could adversely and significantly affect the Buyer's use or enjoyment 18. of the property. If a broker or salesperson working with a Buyer as a customer is representing the Seller, he or 19. she must act in the Seller's best interest and must tell the Seller any information disclosed to him or her, except confidential information acquired in a facilitator relationship (see paragraph V on page two (2)). In that case, the 20. Buyer will not be represented and will not receive advice and counsel from the broker or salesperson. 21.
- II. Subagent: A broker or salesperson who is working with a Buyer but represents the Seller. In this case, the Buyer 22. 23. is the broker's customer and is not represented by that broker. If a broker or salesperson working with a Buyer as 24. a customer is representing the Seller, he or she must act in the Seller's best interest and must tell the Seller any 25. information that is disclosed to him or her. In that case, the Buyer will not be represented and will not receive advice 26. and counsel from the broker or salesperson.
- III. Buyer's Broker: A Buyer may enter into an agreement for the broker or salesperson to represent and act on 27. behalf of the Buyer. The broker may represent the Buyer only, and not the Seller, even if he or she is being paid 28. in whole or in part by the Seller. A Buyer's broker owes to the Buyer the fiduciary duties described on page two 29. (2).(2) The broker must disclose to the Buyer material facts as defined in MN Statute 82.54, Subd. 3, of which 30. the broker is aware that could adversely and significantly affect the Buyer's use or enjoyment of the property. If 31. a broker or salesperson working with a Seller as a customer is representing the Buyer, he or she must act in the 32. Buyer's best interest and must tell the Buyer any information disclosed to him or her, except confidential information 33. acquired in a facilitator relationship (see paragraph V on page two (2)). In that case, the Seller will not be represented 34. and will not receive advice and counsel from the broker or salesperson. 35.
- IV. Dual Agency Broker Representing both Seller and Buyer: Dual agency occurs when one broker or salesperson 36, represents both parties to a transaction, or when two salespersons licensed to the same broker each represent a 37. party to the transaction. Dual agency requires the informed consent of all parties, and means that the broker and 38. 39. salesperson owe the same duties to the Seller and the Buyer. This role limits the level of representation the broker and salesperson can provide, and prohibits them from acting exclusively for either party. In a dual agency, confidential 40. information about price, terms and motivation for pursuing a transaction will be kept confidential unless one party 41. instructs the broker or salesperson in writing to disclose specific information about him or her. Other information 42. will be shared. Dual agents may not advocate for one party to the detriment of the other.(9) 43.
- 44. Within the limitations described above, dual agents owe to both Seller and Buyer the fiduciary duties described on page two (2).(2) Dual agents must disclose to Buyers material facts as defined in MN Statute 82.54, Subd. 3, of 45. which the broker is aware that could adversely and significantly affect the Buyer's use or enjoyment of the 46. 47. property.

V. Facilitator: A broker or salesperson who performs services for a Buyer, a Seller or both but does not represent 51. either in a fiduciary capacity as a Buyer's Broker, Seller's Broker or Dual Agent. THE FACILITATOR BROKER 52 OR SALESPERSON DOES NOT OWE ANY PARTY ANY OF THE FIDUCIARY DUTIES LISTED BELOW, 53. EXCEPT CONFIDENTIALITY, UNLESS THOSE DUTIES ARE INCLUDED IN A WRITTEN FACILITATOR 54. SERVICES AGREEMENT. The facilitator broker or salesperson owes the duty of confidentiality to the party but 55. owes no other duty to the party except those duties required by law or contained in a written facilitator services 56. 57. agreement, if any. In the event a facilitator broker or salesperson working with a Buyer shows a property listed by the facilitator broker or salesperson, then the facilitator broker or salesperson must act as a Seller's Broker (see 58. paragraph I on page one (1)). In the event a facilitator broker or salesperson, working with a Seller, accepts a 59. 60. showing of the property by a Buyer being represented by the facilitator broker or salesperson, then the facilitator 61. broker or salesperson must act as a Buyer's Broker (see paragraph III on page one (1)).

- This disclosure is required by law in any transaction involving property occupied or intended to be occupied by (1) 62. 63. one to four families as their residence.
- The fiduciary duties mentioned above are listed below and have the following meanings: 64. 65.

Loyalty - broker/salesperson will act only in client(s)' best interest. 66.

Obedience - broker/salesperson will carry out all client(s)' lawful instructions. Disclosure - broker/salesperson will disclose to client(s) all material facts of which broker/salesperson has knowledge 67. 68.

which might reasonably affect the client(s)' use and enjoyment of the property.

- Confidentiality broker/salesperson will keep client(s)' confidences unless required by law to disclose specific 69. information (such as disclosure of material facts to Buyers). 70. 71.
- Reasonable Care broker/salesperson will use reasonable care in performing duties as an agent.
- 72. Accounting - broker/salesperson will account to client(s) for all client(s)' money and property received as agent.
- If Seller(s) decide(s) not to agree to a dual agency relationship, Seller(s) may give up the opportunity to sell the 73. property to Buyers represented by the broker/salesperson. If Buyer(s) decide(s) not to agree to a dual agency 74. relationship, Buyer(s) may give up the opportunity to purchase properties listed by the broker. 75.
